As indicated in the enclosed professional references, **Uhl has previously served as a legal consultant and an expert witness. Attorneys have sought his expertise in diverse areas including the following.**

- **Safety and training concerns regarding riding and maintenance of snowmobiles, ATVs, motorcycle dirt bikes, and dual sport motorcycles. Related issues, including the management and practices of recreational facilities and tours.**

- Uhl has over 51 years of experience riding tough terrain around the world under strict time constraints while **winning five gold medals for the U.S.** Uhl competed at the International 6-Day Trials/Enduro—the Olympics of motorcycling. Uhl competed over 150,000 miles during 28 years of competition. He was sponsored as a competitor on U.S. teams by companies as diverse as Penton, Can-Am, Maico, Sach, Hercules, and Puch.
- **He has successfully trained employees at government and international companies.** Uhl blends his technical expertise and knowledge with his exceptional training skills.
- As evidence of his effectiveness, Uhl **has been asked to conduct repeat trainings in organizations** as employees turned over and agency needs expanded. Examples of these organizations are the U.S. Border Patrol, Honda, the U.S. Forest Service, and T-Mobile.

II. MECHANICAL EXPERTISE AND TRAINING OTHERS TO SOLVE MECHANICAL PROBLEMS

As Research and Development Associate with Penton Motorcycles, Uhl instructed mechanics at Penton's Service Schools for the National Dealers Network. The long list of equipment Penton sold was diverse. Uhl was also the

staff member who was dispatched to solve problems when field personnel called Penton headquarters for help.

Uhl also worked as an associate in research and development for a number of other companies as his professional racing career progressed. These companies included: Sach, Puch, Herculys, Maica, Can Am, and Penton.

Uhl has a broad base of mechanical knowledge in all areas related to OHVs because his skills and expertise developed naturally and over time. As a worldwide competitor riding in some of the most grueling climatic and terrain conditions that exist (a career in which he earned five gold medals for the U.S.), Uhl was well aware that mechanical expertise could save his life. In addition, the more often he could fix his own equipment, the more successful his career became. International publicity about Uhl frequently mentioned that he was one of the few international competitors who could build and modify his own racing equipment.

III. TRAIL MAINTENANCE AND CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTS AND SUBCONTRACTS

Mr. Uhl's expertise also led him to complete over 75 miles of government construction and heavy maintenance projects, as well as thousands of miles of light maintenance on multiple-use trails (off-highway vehicle or "OHV" trails used by mountain bicycle riders, hikers, horseback riders, and motorized recreational vehicles). **This includes over 18 years of exemplary experience in trail design and heavy maintenance**, some of which was for the Idaho State Department of Parks and Recreation (IDPR). **Uhl originated the Idaho State Trail Ranger Program over 20 years ago. Uhl also began the state's Trail Cat Program which continues today.** Uhl served as the state's first operator and built trails to accommodate 48" off-highway vehicles. **Uhl possesses an unexcelled passion for healthy, usable, multiple-use trails and trail bridges.**
